Resurrection

1 Corinthians 15:20-49

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

But the fact is, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

For since by a man death came, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at His coming, then comes the end, when He hands over the kingdom to our God and Father, when He has abolished all rule and all authority and power. For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

The last enemy that will be abolished is death. For He has put all things in subjection under His feet. But when He says, “All things are put in subjection,” it is clear that this excludes the Father who put all things in subjection to Him.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

When all things are subjected to Him,
then the Son Himself will also be
subjected to the One who subjected all
things to Him, so that God may be all in
all.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

For otherwise, what will those do who are baptized for the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why then are they baptized for them?

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

Why are we also in danger every hour? I affirm, brothers and sisters, by the boasting in you which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, that I die daily. If from human motives I fought with wild beasts at Ephesus, what good is it to me?

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

If the dead are not raised, let's eat and drink, for tomorrow we die. Do not be deceived: "Bad company corrupts good morals." Sober up morally and stop sinning, for some have no knowledge of God. I say this to your shame.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

But someone will say, “How are the dead raised? And with what kind of body do they come?” You fool! That which you sow does not come to life unless it dies; and that which you sow, you do not sow the body which is to be, but a bare grain, perhaps of wheat or of something else.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

But God gives it a body just as He wished, and to each of the seeds a body of its own. All flesh is not the same flesh, but there is one flesh of mankind, another flesh of animals, another flesh of birds, and another of fish.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

There are also heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is one, and the glory of the earthly is another. There is one glory of the sun, another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for star differs from star in glory.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

So also it is written: “The first man, Adam, became a living person.” The last Adam was a life-giving spirit. However, the spiritual is not first, but the natural; then the spiritual. The first man is from the earth, earthy; the second man is from heaven.

1 Corinthians 15:20-49 (NASB)

As is the earthy one, so also are those who are earthy; and as is the heavenly one, so also are those who are heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthy, we will also bear the image of the heavenly.

Ephesians 3:20-21 (NIV)
